

## Port Arthurian One Of 2 Texans To Win Oak Leaf Clusters

AN EIGHTH AIR FORCE BOMBER BASE, England.—Two Texas fliers were decorated with oak leaf clusters to the air medal for "meritorious achievement" on bomber combat missions over enemy Europe during a recent ceremony at this base, it was announced recently by Lt. Col. Robert W. Burns, commanding officer of the 351st bombardment group.

Second Lt. Dale Foreman, 21, of Amarillo, B17 flying fortress co-pilot, was decorated with his third cluster to the air medal. An alumnus of Amarillo high school and Amarillo college, he entered the service February 19, 1943, and is a veteran of more than 25 aerial assaults on the enemy. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. A. D. Foreman of 3708 East 13 street.

Capt. James F. Lowery, Jr., 27, 921 Thomas boulevard, Port Arthur, was decorated with his second cluster. A fortress pilot he has participated in more than 15 aerial assaults on vital strategic and tactical objectives in Germany. Prior to his entry into the United States air corps on May 10, 1942, he served with the royal Canadian air corps.
