

McCord Will Attend Unveiling In Raleigh

NASHVILLE, Oct. 16.—Governor McCord will fly to Raleigh, N. C., Tuesday to participate in the unveiling of a memorial to three Tennesseans who served as President of the United States.

All three of the Presidents, James K. Polk, Andrew Jackson and Andrew Johnson, were born in North Carolina but were elected while residing in Tennessee.

The Governor said President Truman was scheduled to be present at the ceremony, which he described as "nonpolitical."

Governor McCord will be accompanied by his military aide, Col. Robert Burns, assistant state adjutant general for air.
