

Troubles Plague McCord on Visit

Gov. McCord's upstate visit yesterday left quite a bit of trouble in its wake.

Returning with party chieftains by state plane from the Johnson City area, the Governor found himself grounded late last night in Knoxville because of rain.

Calls for Patrol

A hurried call was dispatched to Nashville for the State Highway Patrol to send two cruisers to pick up the Governor's party.

State Capital cars were running late, so two Knoxville patrol cars were pressed into service. One of the Nashville cruisers wrecked on the curves near Chestnut Mound. The second Nashville car got as far as Cookeville.

Plane Flies Today

There the Knoxville cars carrying the Governor and party met the surviving Nashville cruiser, which turned back. The plane, with Col. Robert Burns at the controls, flew to Nashville today.

State Comptroller Jared Maddox and State Democratic Executive Chairman Frank Hobbs were in the party.

The Governor flew to Johnson City and Bristol to discuss plans for a state armory building—and to look into political trouble stemming from Bob Taylor's decision to manage Gordon Browning's campaign.
